


## How to customize your Website's Error Pages

Create a HTML page for the error number you want to customize.

Using Notepad or a different editor, create **404page.htm**. It may be helpful to the user to provide a link for returning to the homepage, or a help page.


*Example – below is a custom 404 page for david-e-young.com*



Upload this error html file to your website's root folder, or a subfolder if that is where the error pages will be stored.

Locate the **.htaccess** file in the root folder, and download to your computer.

Add a ErrorDocument line with the Error number page being customized, along with the url for the new error page to **.htaccess**. **ErrorDocument 404 /404page.htm**

Upload the modified **.htaccess** file to your Website's root folder.

This approach can be used to customize any number of error pages, where the error number begins with 4## or 5##.

A less-sophisticated approach, is to override the text provided for an error, without providing a helpful error page. This example is from the Apache 2.4 Documentation:

```
ErrorDocument 500 "Sorry, our script crashed. Oh dear"
```
